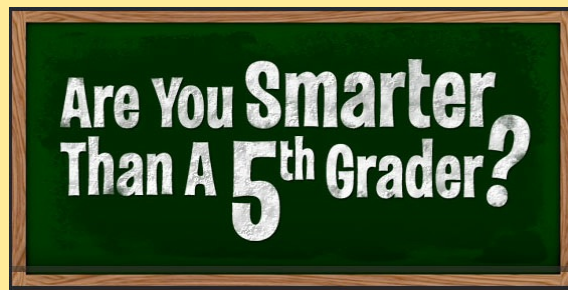

Mathematics

8/31/18
